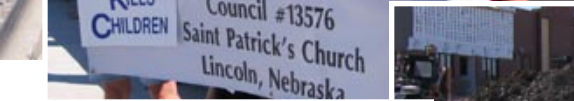

## General Election Nov. 7

It is our Christian, as well as our civic duty to be informed on candidates and issues—and to vote. The most basic civil right of each individual is the right to experience life from conception until natural death. Decisions made at national, state and local levels of government can weaken or strengthen Culture of Life concerns.

These decisions may retain laws passed; the use of our taxes to support policies and organizations – including those with anti-life agendas- or involve the views of judges appointed to courts and of other officials appointed to head agencies or boards or serve on commissions.

Which candidate is chosen for any office is important. Successful candidates frequently will seek higher offices that more directly support or impede Culture of Life concerns. Among the ways to inform ourselves is the Survey of Candidates conducted by the Nebraska Catholic Conference.
